# Saturday All Day Classes

Title of Class: Beginning Pine Needle Basket

Instructor: Vicky Nickelson

Day/Time: Saturday, Oct 19, 10:00 to 5:00 with a 1 hour lunch break

Maximum Students: 10

<u>Description:</u> You will coil with pine needles around a wood base with pre-drilled holes. The Wheat and Fern Stitch will be taught as our coiling stitch. Our binding thread for our beautiful stitches will be faux sinew. You should be able to complete your basket in class.

Required Skills: Hand strength to sew

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> A junky pair of scissors to cut pine needles and a good pair to cut thread. A task light if you require extra lightening.

<u>Supplies Provided by Instructor:</u> Written hand-outs, pine needles, wood base, faux sinew, and a sewing needle.

Title of Class: Moose Hair Tufting

Instructor: Kay Harradine

Day/Time: Saturday, Oct 19, 9:00 to 5:00 with a 1 hour lunch break

Maximum Students: 10

<u>Description:</u> Tufting is an amazing embroidery technique from the far north which takes advantage of the hollow hairs of large mammals living in cold climates. Practice tufting on small scraps, then for this project you will make a small drawn up pouch from buckskin. Decorate the reinforced flap with a tufted design using natural and dyed moose, elk and caribou hair. Finally, you will finish with a three-bead edge stitch. A leather neck cord completes your creation, ready to wear. Note-beadwork may need to be completed outside of class.

Required Skills: Suitable for all, but requires hand strength ability to pull knots tight

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> Small sharp scissors or Fiskars snips, old toothbrush, small towel, pencil, and band aid.

<u>Supplies Provided by Instructor:</u> Buckskin, leather lacing, moose, elk and caribou hair, Pelion, stiffener, Glover's needles, awls, artificial sinew, thread, wax.

Title of Class: Sampler Series in Wet Felting

Instructor: Patti Barker

Day/Time: Saturday, Oct 19, 10:00 to 5:00 with a 1 hour lunch break

Maximum Students: 20

<u>Description:</u> This workshop is designed to give the maker new tools for their fiber art toolbox. Take a textural adventure in felt-making—from simulated animal skins to roses and ruffles, we will entrap beads, learn mosaics and create raised shapes. Participants will come away with six 10"x 10" samplers featuring at least 8 techniques, with instructions and skills to use in creating unique felted items.

Required Skills: Wear comfy shoes; be aware that felting is a vigorous physical activity and requires hand and arm strength and standing for long periods of time.

Supplies Student Should Bring to Class: Sharp, full-sized scissors, two old towels

<u>Supplies Provided by Instructor:</u> Rolling mats, sprayers, soap, vinegar, table risers, sampler kits that include everything you need to create the following: grids, pre-felt shapes and pattern, simulated sheepskin, inclusions and entrapment, roses & ruffles, mosaics and simulated stained glass

Title of Class: Spinning Cotton Fiber

Instructor: Joan Ruane

Day/Time: Saturday, Oct 19, 9:00 to 4:00 with 1 hour lunch break

Maximum Students: 12

<u>Description:</u> Workshop goal: To give students good basic techniques of carding cotton and making yarn from the cotton boll to the dyed sliver. This class is a basic introduction to cotton spinning and is designed to give the spinner an understanding of cotton, and how and why to adjust their wheel for this fine, short staple fiber. Students will learn how to card and make punis from ginned

cotton. We will blend some dyed lint with the natural cotton to give us heathered yarn. Students will not only learn to spin from a puni but also proper techniques for spinning other cotton preparations. At the end of the day cotton singles will be plied so students can go home with a skein of designer cotton yarn.

- Introduction to cotton; kinds and properties.
- Carding cotton and making punis.
- Blending dyed colored cotton for heathered yarns
- Discuss how to dye/paint on cotton fiber
- Adjusting and understanding your wheel
- Techniques of spinning cotton from a puni, off the seed and sliver
- Plying cotton singles

Required Skills: Beginning/Intermediate spinners: Students must be familiar with their wheel and have some spinning experience

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> Spinning wheel in good working condition (*no bulk spinners & bobbin driven wheels are not recommended unless fitted with lace attachment.*) Should have at least a 12/1 ratio on their wheels (no wooly winders please), lazy kate, wheel maintenance items such as oil, extra belt, tools, et., hand carders (cotton preferred but wool acceptable, at least 3 empty bobbins, niddy noddy, dark lap cloth, scissors

Supplies Provided by Instructor: Instruction book, cotton fibers, puni sticks.

Title of Class: CANCELLED Basic Triangle Loom Plain Weaving CANCELLED

Instructor: Kathy Martin

Day/Time: Saturday, Oct 19, 9:00 to 1:00

Maximum Students: 12

<u>Description:</u> This 4 hour workshop will introduce you to the joys of weaving with a continuous strand of yarn. NO WARPING! NO WEFTING! NO HIGHER MATH. The attendee will work with a provided mini-triloom and finish at least 2 triangles with provided yarns. If time allows, the class will cover ways to finish edges. This is a lighthearted workshop and is meant to open minds to this non-traditional weaving technique. Note: A loom will be provided to each student to complete the project in class, however, if the student wishes to purchase the loom, the costs is \$25 and can be purchased from the teacher at the end of the class. The mini-triangle looms are 12" on the hypotenuse side, made out of wood & small headed nails by a local woodworker. The finished triangles can make bandana necklaces; 2 can become a poncho for a doll or a square, 4 a purse or a rectangle. The shapes are like puzzle pieces making scarves, valances, jackets, shawls, hats, blankets - limited only by the imagination.

Required Skills: Beginners welcome

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> Bring several crochet hooks (size F, G, or H) and scissors

Supplies Provided by Instructor: Loaned loom, handouts and yarn to complete project

We will do all three in class using fiber reactive dyes by Jacquard. Janis will demonstrate and then students will do a series of exercises on their own samples for this very colorful class.

Required Skills: No skill required. Beginner level



Title of Class: Finesse your Knitting

Description: Have you been knitting for awhile but haven't been happy with the end product? Are you self-taught or did your grandmother teach you? Always wondered why your knitting isn't as pretty as hers? This is the class for you! We'll learn how to do a cast on that has multiple uses (infinite, 2-color, provisional), learn how to bind off with more elasticity, how to shape shoulders without the bumps and ladders and how to create the perfect one row buttonhole that won't grow! We'll practice a Russian join that is a seamless join, an easy to memorize new graft that replaces the tedious Kitchener Graft and we'll touch upon adding in a new color seamlessly. You'll walk away with a ton of new knowledge and plenty of handouts and resources to take your knitting to an all new level. It's a great class for anyone wishing to hone in on their knitting skills.

Required Skills: Any knitting level is welcome

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> Partial skeins of worsted weight yarn in contrasting colors, Appropriate needle size for chosen yarn

Title of Class: Handspinner's Silk Sampler

Day/Time: Saturday, Oct 19, 9:30 to 12:30

Maximum Students: 15

<u>Description:</u> Ever wonder about Silk Oblongs, Hankies, Throwster, Endi Red, Clouds, or Noil? It is surprising how many options you have in the world of silk, This class will introduce you to some of the types of silk available to spin: Throwster which provides good quality silk at a low cost, Silk Clouds, Laps which are basically a huge batt, and several other forms for you to spin are just some of the examples in silk variety. You will leave the class with knowledge about the difference between the various silk forms, options on how the various types can be spun, what can be blended, and time to spin samples and a format to track your results. We will talk about each of the fiber forms, what to expect in their spinning and look at your spun results and how your finished samples vary.

Required Skills: Able to spin yarn and be knowledgeable about how your wheel or spindle works.

## **Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:**

- 1. Spinning wheel in working order and normal accoutrements such as oil, extra band, etc. If you will be bringing a drop spindle rather than a wheel, it should be one that is fast. If you are using a Turkish Spindle you may have problems with getting the fiber off the crossbars.
- 2. Good quality hand cream to avoid having the silk cling to your hands options include making your own (recipe can be found on Treenway Silks website), purchase a specific spinning hand cream, or using your current hand cream.
- 3. Note taking materials.
- 4. Several bobbins
- 5. Lazy Kate
- 6. Hand cards if you have them we will be doing a small amount of blending. If you don't have them I will have some that can be used in class.

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> Size B (2.25 mm) crochet hook and fingering weight (#1) yarn approximately 35 yds.

Title of Class: **Spin***Possible:* Hand-carding and Longdraw: Blend and Spin your Fiber Stash

Maximum Students: 12

<u>Description:</u> As spinners we often end up with bits of lots of different types of fibers and samples as part of our spinning stash. Carding is a fun way to use your spinning stash and get a perfect yarn for YOU! This class will explore the use of hand-cards to prepare and blend fibers for spinning different types of yarns. We will blend various different types of down fibers (e.g. camel, yak), silks, and we will discuss how to select and blend fibers from your stash to make a fantastic knitting or weaving yarns. This class will also review "woolen" spinning techniques (e.g. longdraw) and how to evaluate the right amount of singles twist and ply twist for the fibers in your custom-carded blend.

Required Skills: Successful students will have a good working relationship with their spinning wheels, be able to spin a consistent single, and have experience plying and finishing yarn.

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> Spinning wheel in good working condition with extra bobbins. If you have your own hand cards, bring them! If you don't yet have your own hand cards, a pair for your use will be provided in class. Bring samples from your stash that you'd like to card!

Supplies Provided by Instructor: Fiber provided to learn techniques

Required Skills: Advanced Beginner level Must have basic (confident) spinning skills on the Wheel.

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> Spinning Wheel (electric is okay) no Spindles Extra bobbin or two, Lazy Kate & wheel accessories

Title of Class: CANCELLED Needle Felting: Intermediate Tips & Techniques CANCELLED

Instructor: Gail Entwistle

Day/Time: Saturday, Oct, 19, 1:30 to 5:30

Maximum Students: 12

<u>Description:</u> This 4 hour class is for those who have done basic needle felting and are now ready to go the next step. We will cover types of needles and their uses, creating eyes, creating hands and fingers, attaching long wool and attaching curls.

- We will use the various needles from your kit to experiment with the surface finish each gives and discuss the best uses of each. This will help you to smooth your surfaces when needed and will speed up your felting.
- For creating eyes, we will make a felted eye from start to finish (if you have a project you are working on feel free to bring it) also we will felt around a glass eye. You will also learn where to place the eyes and the relationship to the nose and forehead.
- Hands and fingers are some of the hardest things to do. I will show you 2 methods, one using Sarafina's swax and the other using glue. We will discuss the 2 methods of making the hands and how to attach them.
- If time allows we will practice attaching long wool or locks to create texture.

Required Skills: Basic needle felting 3-D sculptures

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> If you have a current project, feel free to bring it. <u>Supplies</u>

<u>Provided by Instructor:</u> 4 needles & a holder, wool, wire, glass/acrylic eyes & felting pad.

In this class, Sari will be reviewing basic techniques, going over wheel mechanics, and answering your questions. Too much twist? Under or over plied? Yarn not winding onto the bobbin? Bring your questions and your wheel and let's put the fun (back) into spinning!

Required Skills: Basic familiarity with your wheel and how to run it.

Title of Class: **SpinPossible**: Tweed Effects using Silk

<u>Description:</u> Tweed yarns are great fun to spin! Tweed yarns typically have inclusions which add color or textural elements to a plied yarn, and a great way to add a tweedy effect to your yarn is to use silk! This class will explore getting tweed-like effects using various preparations of silk, including silk top, silk hankies, and silk noil in both preparation and ply.

Required Skills: Successful students will have a good working relationship with their spinning wheels, be able to spin a consistent single, and have experience plying and finishing yarn.

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> A spinning wheel in good working condition with extra bobbins, notebook, and a lazy kate. Hand cards are highly recommended.

<u>Supplies Provided by Instructor:</u> Fiber provided to learn techniques

Title of Class: Two-Handed Fair Isle Knitting

Instructor: Lisa Ellis

Day/Time: Saturday, Oct 19, 2:00 to 4:00

Maximum Students: 15

<u>Description:</u> Two-handed Fair Isle is a must for anyone wishing to knit in color. Strands are weaved in as you knit - thus eliminating the ugly strands in the back of the work that tend to get snagged, pulled and puckered. We'll learn how to pick and throw using both hands at the same time as we practice reading and knitting from a chart.

<u>Required Skills:</u> This class is an Intermediate class. Must have basic color stranding/Fair Isle experience.

Title of Class: Intro to Wicker Weaving

Instructor: Kay Harradine

Day/Time: Sunday, Oct 20, 9:00 to 5:00 with a 1 hour lunch

Maximum Students: 10

<u>Description:</u> The term "Wicker" is derived from the word willow, and generally refers to weaving with long narrow pliable rods or weavers. You will learn the anatomy of a Wicker basket base, upsett, waling and rim. This class will focus on basic wlcker skills, including two- and three-strand twining, and learning tension to control shaping. The material used is "reed" from the rattan plant. Natural and dyed reed will allow you to make a simple pattern of stripes or checkerboard as you weave. Your round bowl-shaped basket will measure approx 9" wide by 6" tall and you should finish your basket by the end of the day.

Required Skills: Beginner and up

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> Sharp scissors, measuring tape, bucket, towel, awl, bandaid, pencil

Students learn how to use a plastic resist pattern, and the difference between closed and open resists. Have fun playing with up-cycled, textural fabrics, such as burned-out velour, sequin embellished silk chiffon and more. Creating matching flowers will be discussed. Some students will complete their hat in class, others may need a second fulling session after they go home.

Maximum Students: 20

<u>Description:</u> Bavarian knitting, originating from the Bavarian Alps region of Europe comprises of traveling cables against twisted stitches. The twisted stitches create clean and well-defined stitches while the traveling cables have a nice design element and are usually 2 stitch cables that don't use cable needles at all. The pattern appearance and charts seem complicated, yet once you understand the chart symbols, it becomes easy to follow and addicting! It's a classic design and looks great on men, women and children. In class, we'll practice a 2-color cast on, reading a Bavarian chart, and working cables without a cable needle along with 4 basic Bavarian cable stitches.

Required Skills: Advanced Beginner and above. Must be able to work in the round.

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> 1 skein of light worsted weight yarn, in lighter colors, 3 yds of a contrasting dark colored light worsted yarn for trim (instructor will also provide available trim yarn,) US size 5, 16" circular needles (please no magic loop or 2 sets of circs), St markers.

<u>Description:</u> This 4-hour workshop will provide some creative time and information for hand-painting skeins of natural fiber yarn (protein/animal fibers). My version of this technique involves sponge brushes and/or squirt bottles, depending on the desired results. Acid dyes can sound scary and the process can worry the new dyer. The attendee will learn how to use acid dyes and learn by trial what colorways appeal. No color wheels will be allowed. "Outside the box" or "outside the lines" creativity is encouraged. Microwave will be used to set colors. In class, we will discuss other options for this simple dyeing technique such as rovings, locks, and batts. We will be using Greener Shades brand dyes, a brand which is free of heavy metals.

Required Skills: Beginners welcome

Supplies Student Should Bring to Class: Student should wear working clothes or apron

<u>Supplies Provided by Instructor:</u> Dyeing supplies, three 150-yard wool skeins in fingering or sport weight, gloves, and mask.

<u>Description:</u> As a friend calls it "spinning a banana split", we will spin everything from pineapple to banana and even milk fiber. Bioengineered fibers are man-made from organic natural fiber-based composites, sometimes called "vegan" fibers or ECO- friendly fibers. The consistency of the fiber depends on the variety of the plant, source, species and the geographic area. The best part of these fibers is that they are biodegradable and non-carcinogenic. We will be spinning a wide variety of man-made fibers and each has its own characteristics.

Required Skills: Intermediate spinners: Students must be familiar with their wheel and have some spinning experience.

<u>Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:</u> A small niddy noddy, string labels and a marking pen (we will be making a lot of small skeins to label and take home,) spinning wheel in good working condition, and small baggies.

Supplies Provided by Instructor: A variety of bioengineered fibers and handouts

Title of Class: Super-Flax-Expialidocious –Learning to Spin Wet Line Flax

Instructor: Karen Chabinsky

Day/Time: Sunday, Oct 20, 9:00 to 12:00

Maximum Students: 12

<u>Description:</u> Spinning Flax has been done for thousands of years and today we can easily purchase pre-processed Flax in stricks, ready to spin. Spinning Flax is actually pretty easy. In this class will talk about what the process is to ready the Flax plant for spinning, have you working with the strick to ready it for the spinning process, and then wet spinning Line Flax into the yarn form. If you have a distaff you will be able to use that for spinning (Note: If you do not have a distaff on your wheel you can also use a pole inserted into a belt around your waist/leg or use a coat rack – see Supplies Student Should Bring to Class). If you do not have a distaff you have the option of using a towel to spin from. We will also discuss how to finish your spun Flax via scouring and the process involved.

Required Skills: Be able to spin yarn and be knowledgeable about how your wheel works.

## **Supplies Student Should Bring to Class:**

- 1. Spinning wheel in working order and normal accoutrements such as oil, extra band, etc.
- 2. Large whorl to have more tension (pull), so you can go slower as you learn the process. You should end up about an 11:1 ratio as you get more comfortable with this spinning.
- 3. Small towel for your lap keeps the bowl with water from slipping and the remaining boon from going everywhere.
- 4. Medium size towel if you are not going to use a distaff.
- 5. Distaff There are a couple of options:
  - a. Regular distaff attached to your wheel.
  - b. Use a pole and a belt to go around your waist or leg make sure that it will stay in place. If you attach it to your leg, you may need a couple of ties around your leg to keep it in place, possibly inserting the end in the side of your shoe. To purchase a pole for a belt, you can pick up dowels or bamboo poles from one of the home improvement stores. Make sure the pole/dowel is long enough to go about a foot and a half above your head. You will need to be able to hang the strick near the top and it should stay in place an option would be to put in a couple of tacks or push pins that stick out so you can hang the strick on it and it will stay at that level. Using a couple coming down from the top will also allow you to adjust it to a level that will work for you (which you won't know until we start spinning.)
  - c. This is my favorite option I think the easiest is to use a stand-alone coat rack with pegs. I use one that disassembles completely and is similar to the sample shown. Searching some of the large on-line retailers I have found these coat trees for less than \$25.00. I like this better than the other options as you can lower the strick as you use up the fiber in the spinning and it stands by itself and is easy to move around to get the best position to spin from. Sample photo is attached.
  - d. If you don't want to use an actual distaff, you can also just use a medium sized towel to wrap the strick in on your lap.

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- 7. Two (2) plastic bags you get from the grocery store You can fill them with other bags or some sort of lite material (weight-wise) or you can make a fabric bag about the same size and stuff it. It will need to be able to be tied to the distaff.
- 8. Note taking materials if needed.
- 9. Flicker brush (if you don't have one I will have a couple available).
- 10. Bobbins that you can use with water. Worst case you can wind off the spun fiber after class so your bobbin won't be affected or encase the inside of your bobbin with saran wrap or other type of waterproofing.

Supplies Provided by Instructor: Stricks, water, small bowls, sponges, and printed material.
